Session VI: Agriculture and climate – Success stories in translational research

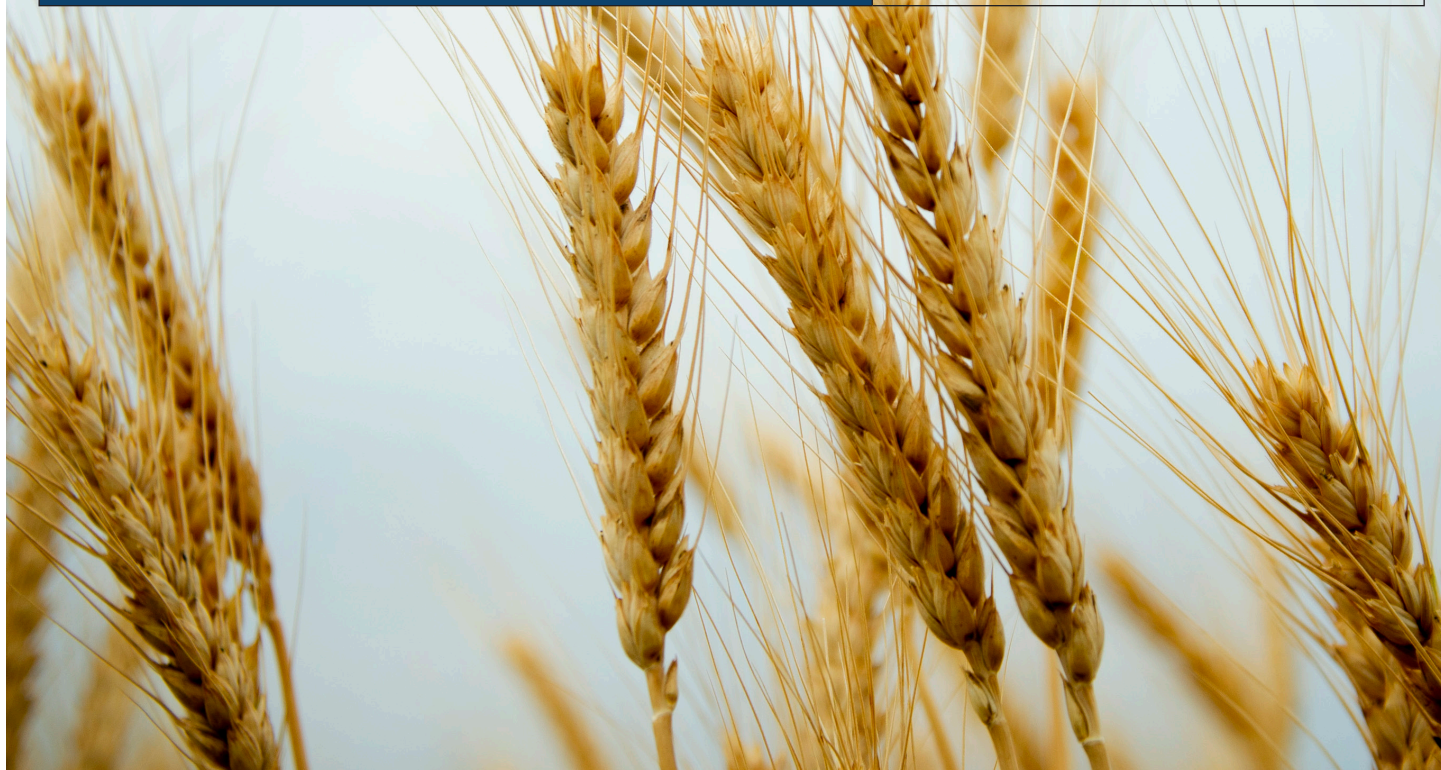
The selected applicants will be screened by the international screening committee and will be shortlisted for oral or flash talks or poster presentations
